After completing this lesson, the student will:

*Memorize the 8th Commandment and meaning.

*Understand and Realize the importance of reputation in the life of a Christian.

*Continue completing The 10 Commandment Tablet.

*Mature in respect of other's reputation and one's use of the tongue.

*Be able to apply Godly talk principles in their lives.

*Know what is commanded and forbidden in The Eighth Commandment.

*Understand Scripture's view of 'Explaining all in the kindest way.'

1. Introduction:

Watch video: (Parents are to meet with students during instruction with this commandment).

- Continuation of 10 Commandment Tablets: 10 Words to be used in the tablets: GOD, MARRIAGE and SEXUALITY, POSSESSION, COVETING PEOPLE, <u>REPUTATION</u>, GOD'S WORD, GOD'S NAME, <u>AUTHORITY</u>, LIFE, COVETING THINGS.
- 3. Have you ever played the game called the phone tree? Line up 5 people and tell the first person a story, any story that has 10-12 facts. Have that person tell the person next to them, then they tell what they heard to the person next to them the story they heard and continue unto the last person. Have the last person tell the story and compare it to the original story. What happened? What might happen when we listen to gossip? Why do people Gossip. Why does God call us not to 'bear false witness?' Next to your faith and your life, what is the most important thing that matters to you? Hint; It will impact your friends, your future spouse, your career and most things in your life. It's something that can't be bought, but it can be improved. It can be tarnished by others and one's actions and behaviors can brighten or diminish it. Hint It mainly has to do with others think of you. Can you find that in the list on question 2?

- 8. Read question 62 on pp. 88-89. What does God require of us in the 8th Commandment?

*Someone didn't pay me back the money I borrowed them when they said they left their money at home.

*Someone dresses poorly and their parents drive old used cars that are beat up.

- C. "Explain everything in the kindest way." That's part of the meaning of the 8th commandment and one of the three requirements of this commandment. What does it mean to explain everything in the kindest way?
- 9. Bible Narratives: Look at the Bible narratives throughout this commandment. Pick one. Like Mark 14:3-9, "Jesus spoke well of the woman who appointed him." Draw a picture and relate that to a specific teaching/truth in the meaning.

10. Sayings: Write the meaning of the 8th commandment here. Now react to these statements according to the meaning.

*Don't tell anyone I told you, but did you hear?

*Speak the truth in love.

*Talk to me, not about me.

*Praise in public, criticize in private.

*I don't mean to gossip, but did you hear?

*Judge not unless you be judged.

*A gossiper will say something behind your back and never to you and a flatterer will say something to your face and never to anyone else.

*Gossip, lies, slander and false witness destroys a Christian community.
