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## ST. JOHN LUTHERAN CHURCH CONFIRMATION THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

Lesson 13: "The Close of the Commandments" (L13) Year 1 (7<sup>th</sup> Grade)

After completing this lesson, the student will:

- \*Recite all Ten Commandments.
- \*Grow in basic knowledge of sin and Law and Gospel.
- \*Know the difference between faithful keeping and despising of God's Law.
- \*Can tell the difference between original and actual sin.
- \*Hear and know that the Gospel overcomes sin and the Law.
- \*Know what is commanded and forbidden in The 9<sup>th</sup>/10th Commandments.
- \*Share who is to hear the Law and who is to hear the Gospel.
  - 1. Introduction:

Watch video: (Parents are to meet with students during instruction with this commandment).

- 2. Review The 10 Commandment Tablets: 10 Words to be used in the tablets: **GOD,** *MARRIAGE and SEXUALITY,* POSSESSION, **COVETING PEOPLE**, <u>REPUTATION</u>, *GOD's WORD,* **GOD'S NAME**, <u>AUTHORITY</u>, **LIFE**, *COVETING THINGS*.
- 3. Natural consequences. God has written His Law and Will into nature. For example, if one stops eating, what will happen? If we don't manage God's resources what will happen? If we don't respect authority, what will happen? What will happen if we treat others poorly? What happens if we don't obey traffic lights? What happens if we eat constantly poor food? Or healthy food? What happens if we respect and love others? There are natural blessings and consequences to our actions.
