

### "Love, Political Style."

We are sadly very well aware of the political turmoil in our nation today. Someone stated that it seems that even though we are in the opening days of 2021, it's the same as 2020. We can't turn on the news without viewing events and headlines that we never could have imagined decades if not just a few short years ago. Here are some gems from Dr. Luther and Scripture that shine light and give us blessing and insight in how a Christian navigates through challenging times. To many, February is "Love month!"



- *THE TWO KINGDOMS*: A better way to look at politics is to view our life through what Dr. Martin Luther called, "Two Kingdom Theology," or "The Church and The State." The Church operates through the Holy Spirit, the power is the Word and the goal is salvation for all. The State operates through the Sword, the power is God-given earthy authority and the goal is common-sense legislature that seeks the best for all. We believers live in both Kingdoms at the same time.
- *TRUST NOT IN PRINCES*: The Psalmist reminds us that Princes, that is, "The State", is limited in its role, that God is in control, and only Christ can ultimately sustain and save us. There is a danger in putting too much trust and hope in government as it functions with, many times, well-intentioned but sinful people, and its role is limited to blessing and sustaining our physical life.
- *VOTE YOUR CONSCIENCE*: Dr. Luther wrote that "Our conscience is a sacred thing." It is never the role of the Church or a Pastor to tell one "how" to vote, but to vote their conscience with the guidance of the Holy Spirit and a mind and soul matured by the Word. Government, while ordained by God, operates out of worldly wisdom and cannot address spiritual issues.
- *PRAY FOR ALL KINGS AND RULERS*: 1 Timothy reminds us that we are to pray for all of those in earthly authority, whether we voted for them or not. The rulers of the earthly Kingdom were placed there by God and we are called to pray for them both privately and publicly. During my time in office, I have prayed for George, Barack, Donald, and now Joseph (four U.S. Presidents). Even though we may struggle with the behavior and our lack of trust in earthly authority and elected officials, as once was said to me, "If God can't help them no one can."

The Epistle, February 2021

In other words, we can have more profound, blessed and eternal relationships with fellow brothers and sisters in Christ than with other family members besides our own physical family. We believers' relationships are bound together in the Body of Christ, our common confession of faith and mutual love for one another, in spite of and over and above our political views, affiliations and opinions.
- THE CHURCH IS NOT THE STATE: The Church does not exist to promote political philosophies. Christ our Lord said very little or nothing about the political systems of His day. The Word really doesn't espouse any one certain form of government or economic system. What the Church does is obey the state in accordance with God's Word and support the State in its endeavor to maintain order and oversee the physical affairs of this world. God works through and the State that blesses the church with freedoms and protections.
- LOVE ONE ANOTHER: This refers to specifically loving someone who disagrees with our political views. We recognize and cherish each conscience to vote and support and espouse their own political views.
- *THIS KINGDOM WILL END*: While the Kingdom of the State will end, the Kingdom of the Church will endure forever. In heaven there will be no need for any of the worldly institutions God ordained. In heaven, there will be no sin, and God will provide all perfectly for us.
- Finally, God bless, enable and strengthen us that we may be faithful and dutiful citizens of both Kingdoms. We rejoice that Christ Jesus left His realm in heaven to be with us in our earthly realm that one day we might be with Him forever in His heavenly realm.

Den leaders are currently providing activities virtually as well as by materials that can be picked up at a safe location. Although there was a minimal amount of snow, Cubs went sledding on the hill at the Defiance Reservoir in mid-January.

Cubs will celebrate Scouting's birthday (111 years!) this month with its annual Blue and Gold Banquet. Due to COVID, however, it will be modified and will be a parking lot ceremony. Recognitions and advancements will be the focus, along with a Cross-Over when four Webelos Cubs will transfer to the Boy Scout Troop.

The youth leadership of the Troop is currently planning future activities but due to COVID there are limitations. The Troop was working on map reading and knots to help prepare for the Klondike Derby that was to be held in January at Camp Berry. Unfortunately, due to COVID, the Derby was postponed until April, where adjustments will be made to the traditional format.

#### FROM THE DESK OF PRINCIPAL JOHN MARCH:

This month marks a significant day in our Western Culture - Valentine's Day! The day we celebrate love with red hearts, roses, balloons, candy and chocolate, and stuffed animals that sing songs of love. For the past month we have seen shelves in the stores stocked full with flowers, hearts, chocolate, and more. It seems like the stores prepare earlier and earlier each year...right after Christmas (or even before) the color red saturates the stores! Do you know that more roses are sold on February 14<sup>th</sup> than any other day of the year? It truly is the day that people show their love for someone special.

My wife, along with other females, are taken out to a nice restaurant, or have a meal cooked for them. It is a great occasion to express love and appreciation for any of your loved ones, but it is just as important to show little acts of kindness the other 364 days of the year.

When you really think about it, the card, the chocolates, the dinner out, all could be done without; but it is the significance of the words "I love you" or the hugs and kisses from your children that really matters. My wife and I always end our conversation on the phone with "I love you". Why? I guess ultimately it is because we only have today. We are not promised tomorrow. When we hear those words, "I love you" – they really are the best gift, day after day.

This past year has been a challenge with Covid-19 and the guarantines. My wife's family lives in Canada and due to Covid we haven't been able to see them for a year now. It has been very difficult to not see them. Yes, it is nice to have technology where we can Facetime and chat, but it isn't the same as being with them. This past year has really caused us to appreciate the time we have spent together, and the simple things like sharing a meal, sitting on the couch together, talking face to face, and whispering "I love you" while embracing. Most importantly, we have truly relied on the promises of God over these months, especially the promise that God will never leave us or forsake us. He will answer us when we call day or night. Hé never slumbers nor sleeps.

So, as we focus on Love this month, we need to tell Jesus how much we love Him 365 days a year as well! The flowers will die. Candy gets eaten. Balloons will pop. Stuffed animals may stop singing. Cards may get lost or thrown away, but the love that is shared with one another, and God's love for us, will never pass away.

Isaiah 54:10 says, "Though the mountains be shaken and the hills be removed, yet My unfailing love for you will not be shaken nor my covenant of peace be removed," says the LORD, who has compassion on you."

My challenge for you this month is to find little ways to show some acts of kindness to those you love after Valentine's Day this year. We need to be actively doing what Hebrews 10:24 says, which is, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds."

"We want Love to be in the air at all times!"

"If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, and it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, and always perseveres.

Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when perfection comes, the imperfect disappears. When I was a child, I talked like a child; I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me. Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, . even as I am fully known.

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." 1 Corinthians 13

# **Benefits of Planning**

Frank and Katherine were raised to be thrifty, hard-working, God-fearing, children of God. They raised their children in the faith as well and enjoyed sharing Bible stories with their grandchildren.

Frank and Katherine were known to not waste a thing, washing, and reusing disposable items, ripping off the bottom half of a piece of mail that came to use for scrap paper. They had been diligent savers, putting a portion of weekly income into an investment account.

Years ago, their advisor had directed them to put investments in annuities. Since that time, all growth on their investments had grown tax deferred. They never planned on spending any of it. They planned on giving it all to their children as inheritance. Little did they know that a large portion of that inheritance would simply be paid in taxes.

An LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor had presented at their church and raised the topic of wise tax planning. They brushed it off. They did not see the value. This couple who rejoiced about saving pennies at a time by reusing old things, threw away tens of thousands of dollars in taxes that could have enriched their children's inheritance or created a nice bequest to their church, enabling more people to hear about Jesus.

We often put off such work, because it intimidates us, as we venture into topics that we have never discussed before. Yet the story of Frank and Katherine illustrates, for all of us, that a few hours of conversation and planning could potentially magnify the effect of a lifetime of careful stewardship of God's gifts.
