## Relationships Are R2

R squared (R2). That’s how relationships were written when I was in graduate school at the University of Iowa. R squared, two people times each other. To illustrate, Steven Covey in his book, “The 7 habits of Highly Successful People,” shares that relationships are like bank accounts. By two caring people being together their dividend grows and multiplies. Likewise, hurt, betrayal and lies can be costly withdrawals. To Covey, the more input into the relationship, the more it grows; friendships and caring relationships naturally grow as dividends are added. Scripture too speaks of this. 1 Thessalonians amplifies R2 and Covey’s correct calculations. Our entire life with God is nothing more than R2 with God and R2 with others. Here are 7 more relational gems:

- R2- Our relationship to God is really a redemptive relationship with God. Believers are those who live in daily repentance and trust in Christ for their forgiveness and salvation. “We are saved by grace through faith.”
- R2- God made us each individually with unique talents and gifts, and to be with each other, we belong to the “Communion of Saints”.
- R2– Relationships take work, effort, and prayer. Encouraging and building one another up takes time and is intentional. Review the above verse.
- R2- The entire relationship of a church is mainly relational. Show me a person not in church and I will show you a person with few relationships in the church. Show me a person in church and I will show you a person with a lot of relationships. “The habit of worshipping together!”
- R2- Shepherds (Pastors) don’t make sheep, but can develop caring relationships. Sheep can have deep relationships with sheep. Sheep may have relational gifts that a Shepherd can’t have, as we/they are “The body of Christ”.
- R2– Relationships often times are inconvenient. They need to become intentional and personal and they will interfere sometimes with our busy lives that can be self-centered. The Good Samaritan was inconvenienced, but assisted the hurt individual. He did more than talk but proved his relationship with action. Jesus tells us to “Go and do likewise”.
- R2– Are one-on-one. Jesus took time for the one-on-one. R2 need one-on-one time. I still remember the time many years ago, when my 5<sup>th</sup> grade Lutheran school teacher visited with my parents in our home. Jesus took time to talk with the Samaritan woman, Mary and others.

### ◇ Exodus Thursday A.M. Bible Study

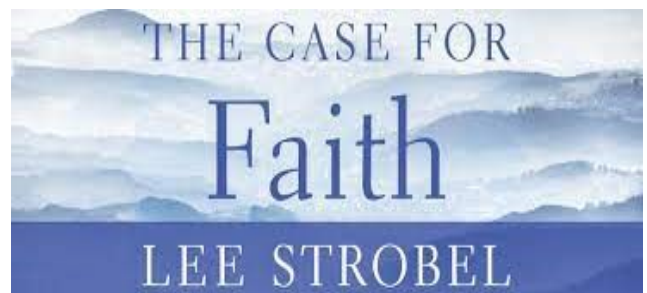

Summer provides a variety of fun and exciting activities for Cubs to enjoy. In June, Cubs will be able to participate in two different events: the Backyard Olympic Games & Picnic as well as the Rain Gutter Regatta. The Backyard Olympic Games will test Cubs in their running and throwing skills while the Rain Gutter Regatta, an annual event, will find them moving sailboats made from a kit down a water-filled rain gutter by blowing on the sails.

Cubs will also be busy in July with two events: Wakheya Weekend when families can have an overnight camping experience and Cub Scout Camp, a week where Cubs spend each day doing a variety of activities, shooting BB guns and bows/arrows, making crafts, taking nature hikes, climbing the tower, among others. 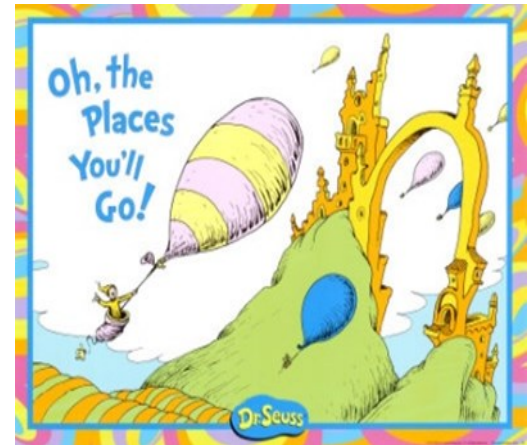

We thank the Thrivent Action Teams, members of St. John and the community in supporting our fundraiser. God truly blessed our project!

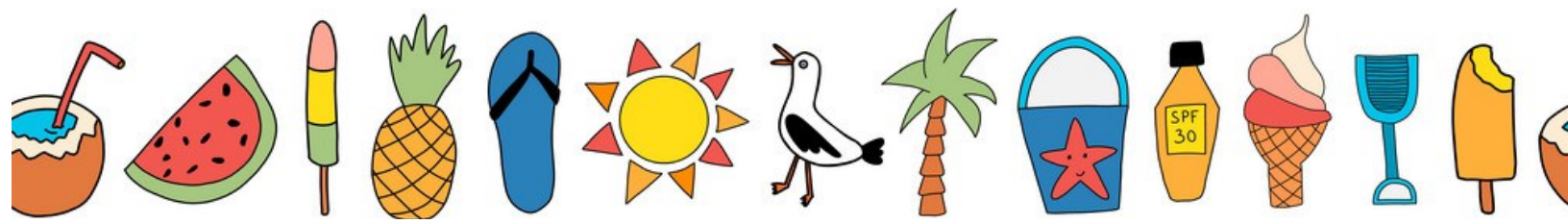

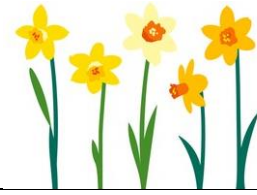

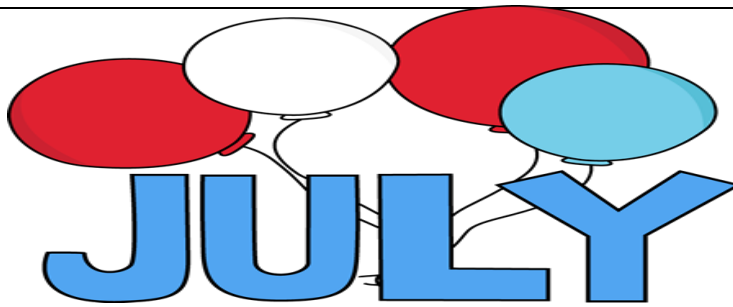
