ALL IN FOR ALL SAINTS' DAY

"For all the saints who from their labors rest, who Thee by faith before the world confessed, Thy name, O Jesus, be forever blest, Alleluia, Alleluia."

(For All the Saints, LSB #677, Stanza 1).

Halloween is a holiday which many Americans love. It's a treasured day of fall leaves, candy freely given, a whole host of creative and popular costumes, unique colors, TV shows, movies, sights and sounds. It's even expanded into its own Halloween "Genre." However, many are not aware that Halloween's history is in All Saints' Day, the Christian holiday of November 1. Most in America are unfamiliar with this blessed day in which Christians remember those who died in the faith the year before. The root of the word, Halloween, Hallow's een, Hallow's Eve, All Hallow's Eve, All Saint's Eve, is tied to the evening of that special day in which Christians recall family and friends who the previous 12 months or 365 days have been called to their eternal home.

While All Saints' Day is November 1, it is often celebrated by Christians on the first Sunday in November after that day. We are blessed this year that Reformation Sunday falls on its correct date of October 31. This means that All Saints' Day will be celebrated the first Sunday after the first of November, Sunday, November 7. Dr. Martin Luther deliberately posted the 95 Theses on the north Wittenberg church door on October 31 (All Saint's Eve-All Hallow's Eve). It was a marketing strategy, realizing that a large percentage of parishioners would be heading to church in November 1 in honor of that holy day and to remember their 'sainted' relatives who died the previous year. In the German language a number of Lutheran churches call it Allerheiligen, 'All who are holy/saints day.'

WHY All Saints' Day? It is a way for Christians to (1) thank God for the faith and life of their loved ones and other Christians who died; (2) celebrate that their loved one is with the Lord; (3) be comforted that their loved one is in peace; (4) confess that Jesus Christ overcame our/mankind's biggest enemy, Death.

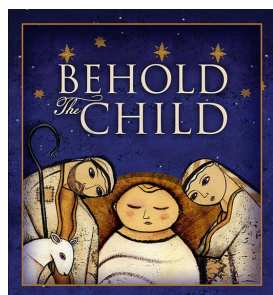
Scouting News

FROM THE DESK OF PRINCIPAL JOHN MARCH:

Dear St. John Family:

I have been more and more impressed upon from the Holy Spirit about the importance of our school and the necessity of it in Defiance. Our church, for over 150 years, has brought the message of Jesus's saving love and grace to the population of our town. We have had a direct impact of the lives of families in Defiance through our school. Our church's forefathers recognized the importance of teaching the children about God. They understood the importance of what Moses said to the children of Israel about teaching their children about God:

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates."
Deuteronomy 6:4-9

God wanted parents to teach their children about him everywhere: their houses, walking, lying down, and when they got up. When you think about that, that is all the time! But realistically, how can we, as parents, do this? Proverbs 1:7 says, "the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge." As a result of this, it is so important that our children are being taught through a Biblical worldview.

Did you know that our children have approximately 2,210 days for 13 years of K-12 education (not including preschool)? Think about the importance of the foundation or worldview that our children are being taught through their daily lessons and information. Unfortunately, public schools cannot support Biblical teachings. Instead, they tend to ignore God. We see this especially throughout science, starting with the origins of man and evolution, as well as in sex education (LGBTQ+ ideology, critical race theory, etc.). Of course, not all public school teachers reject the Bible; however they are very limited as to what they can do or say. Do we want 2,210 days of our children's lives to be focused on an anti-Christian worldview? On a worldview that rejects Jesus Christ as the Savior of the world?

The GREAT news is that OUR SCHOOL will allow 1,530 days, or 70% of your child's school days, to be taught through a Christian worldview, focused on Christ, His Word, and His teachings. What an incredible gift that is! As a parent trying to fulfill the teachings of Christ, I value our school and the Christian worldview my children are being taught. This will help enable me, as a parent, to do what Moses said and teach my children the ways of the Lord throughout the day.

As a church we need to be supporting this vital ministry of our church! What an impact for Christ we have at each level of the school! From preschool all the way through 8th grade the students are able to learn and discuss relevant and pertinent information and topics through a Christian lens, delving into Scripture about what God says about the topic at hand. We also need to be actively encouraging our members to send their children here, and telling others about the wonderful Christian education that our students receive at the school.

Please continue to pray for our school, its mission, and the lives that are being impacted for Christ.

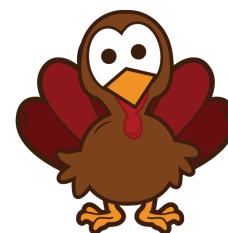
