



RECLAIM THE CALL. RESTORE THE JOY.

In May, administrative leaders from SJL Church/School attended a one-day workshop at Camp Luther Haven in Indiana, where we learned the blessings of Godly rest. Here are some discoveries:

GODLY REST DEFINED:

"And on the 7th Day, God rested!" Genesis 2:3



Rest is a necessary part of being a Christian. God took time to rest and so should we. Jesus says, "Come unto me you who are weary and I will give you rest." In our rush world, many see rest as a way to be lazy or an excuse to not cope. Some even suggest, "I will get all the rest I need when I'm dead." Yet Scripture views rest as something very good.

Rest is Holy, See Genesis 2:3. Rest in Non-negotiable, it's commanded. See Deuteronomy 5:12. Rest is a Rhythm, it's tied to work. See Exodus 20:9 and Deut. 5:3. Rest is Rewarding, See Isaiah 58:13-14. Rest is a Community Commitment, See Deut. 5:15.

Here is the Godly definition of rest that we learned: "Rest is not a reward. You can't earn it. You don't deserve it. It will never be convenient. Rest is a rhythm ordained by God and a responsibility for those committed to do God's best."

RESTORATIVE WELLNESS:

The bottom line of restorative wellness highlights the **Quality and Quantity** of our rest. We have been given by God 168 hours a week and 84 of them ought to be rest. Keep count, as Godly rest is:

SABBATH: This **Relationally** reconnects us with God and people, and priorities are held most dear. We are able to pray and play unhindered and unhurried. In other words, take a day to worship and recreate wholesomely. (16 hours)

SLEEP: This **Physically** rejuvenates us. Make it a priority to get 7-9 hours of rest a day for health and vibrancy. (56 hours)

Summer provides a variety of fun and exciting activities for Cubs to enjoy. In June, Cubs and their families will be traveling to the National Museum of the US Air Force at Wright-Pattterson Air Force Base near Dayton. It is the oldest and largest military aviation museum in the world. Galleries include the early years, World War II, the Korean War, the Southeast Asian War, the Cold War, Space and Presidential, among others.

In July, the Rain Gutter Regatta, an annual event, will find them moving sailboats made from a kit down a water-filled rain gutter by blowing on the sails. Water games and a visit to the Bronson Park Splash Pad are also a part of the Regatta. Cubs will also be busy in July with two other events: Wakheya Weekend, when families can have an overnight camping experience, and Cub Scout Camp, a week where Cubs spend each day doing a variety of activities, from shooting BB guns and bows/arrows, making crafts, taking nature hikes, to climbing the tower, along with other activities. Both of these events will be held at Camp Lakota.

The Troop will be attending a week of summer camp at Lakota in July, as has been done for many years. Scouts will have an opportunity to complete a number of merit badges but also have time for a number of fun activities, including using the water slides, swimming, fishing, canoeing, kayaking and sail boating in Lake Glengary, sharpening their skills in shooting sports with rifles, shot guns and bow/arrows, making crafts, and practicing various scout skills, to name a few. Leadership development is also an important aspect of summer camp.

In addition to summer camp, the Troop will be joining the Pack at the National Museum of the US Air Force. Two Troop members and two adult leaders will also be going to Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico, one of Boy Scouts' high adventure bases. This trek involves backpacking for 12 days in the backcountry of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains.


