

#### FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MEWS:

#### "IS DOCTRINAL UNITY A LUXURY?"

"Be eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." Ephesians 4:3

Teams, organizations and individuals who understand and unite their mission and purpose tend to be successful, work together more closely, and are more empathetic towards each other. In a day and age "When any God or religion will do," it's hard to stress, urge, promote and insist on doctrinal unity and teaching and practice in Scripture. Our world is flooded with the thoughts, "that any God will do," "at least they're in church," and "Jesus doesn't major in the minors, so



neither should we." Is unity in our belief and practice on Christian doctrines essential or is it a luxury? Luxury is a Greek word rooted in the term "decadence" and "over-abundance." In other words, luxury is excess of privilege. Some would conclude as long as one keeps with the main teachings of the Bible, then we should all be content. What do you think: Is doctrinal unity a luxury? Or is it essential? Professor Theodore Engelder wrote extensively about this question in his essay "Is Doctrinal Unity a Luxury?" Theodore Engelder, (1865-1949) draws to Biblical, confessional and practical conclusions that doctrinal unity in not a luxury, but a necessity.

GOD'S WORD: "Be eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit, beware of false teachers, agree with another, do not receive anyone who does not hold to this teaching, teach them to obey all thing I have commanded to you and I do not shrink from declaring to you the entire counsel of God." Each of those words are God's revelation to us in His Word, Holy Scripture! Doctrinal unity is a prerequisite, a 'must.'

THE CHURCH'S STRENGTH: Dr. Francis Pieper, the LCMS go-to guy when it comes to Christian teachings, shares the stark reality of the necessity of this type of unity: "The Church attains at all times its greatest strength when she abides by the Word of God in all points. It is folly to think that yielding this or that part of Christian doctrine would be to the best interest of the Church. We deceive ourselves if we thought the union with false teaching or its toleration.....would be of benefit to the Church."

THE BATTLE IS OF GOD, FOR GOD, FROM GOD: Dr. Luther's gifted words and illustrations have a knack to express the profound in enlightening images. He states, "If the devil brings it about that men yield to him in one article, he has won the battle....They are all bound together like a gold chain; if one link is broken, the whole chain falls apart."

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN? As "the Word of God stands forever," doctrinal unity is a necessity for our faith in Christ and life with God together. Any conflict or disagreement needs to first look to doctrinal unity and use that as a blueprint for Godly resolution. This unity of doctrine first and foremost views all as children of God, for whom Christ died, rose and ascended to heaven. This is the blueprint for all of our church/school ministry, and this basic touch-point is the springboard for common work.

Is Doctrinal Unity a must? Yes, and as the Holy Spirit guides us to mature in the faith, our unity will only grow deeper and be used by God for the well-being of His Church and mission on earth.

#### FROM THE DESK OF PRINCIPAL JOHN MARCH:


Dear St. John Family,

As we enter a new year, it is tradition to reflect on the past year and look forward with great anticipation for all that God will do in 2023. This past year had some wonderful moments and some very challenging times for myself, my family, as well as the school and church. One of the highlights for our family this past year was that our daughter, Cailyn, was confirmed. My wife and I are proud of who she is becoming and pleased to see that her faith in her Savior continues to grow. The verse that she chose as her confirmation verse was 2 Timothy 1:7, "for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control."



She spoke in front of the church about the fact that she was, and is, a timid person. She has always been fearful of things. As a young child she used to cling to my wife's leg wherever we were. At times she allows her fear to overtake her, but with God's help she is overcoming that fear. My mother gave Cailyn a beautiful necklace for confirmation, that says "Faith over Fear". It is a constant daily reminder that with God beside her. He is

fighting her battles and He is in control; all that she needs to do is to have faith in her Savior and let Him handle the situation.



their future, for making the right decisions; we fear for the future of the church and school; yes, we are consumed by fear, worry and anxiety! And God knows this. Do you know that there are 365 times in the Bible that God tells us not to fear? That is one for each day of the year! He knows that our flesh is weak and that worry and anxiety can take over, so He gives us a daily reminder that "He has this!"

She has verses around her room that remind her of these promises, that tell her not to fear. She wears jewelry with verses on them that say, "Do not fear". As we begin 2023, this month begins registration for our school for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year. It is easy for me to worry about the student numbers, for numbers drive our budget. Our current student population for this school year is 105 students, and we need more students! In January we also start planning and working on our big spring fundraiser that is so vital to our school budget. Yet, God has reminded me, "Do not fear!" As we continue faithfully serving God and telling His message of salvation to our students and their families, He sees this and He will continue to provide. As Cailyn reminds me, "Dad, God's got this! And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

## Scout News January 2023



The Pack will be holding a "Cubanapolis" this month. Each Cub will make a car out of a cardboard box and decorate it anyway he wants. His family will serve as his pit crew. The Cub will run around the course for six laps with pit stops to change his tires, fuel up and clean his windshield. Pit stops will involve: 1) cleaning the windshield - spray goggles 2 times and wipe with rag, 2) changing tires - remove shoes, turn socks inside out, put shoes on again, 3) a photo op - remove helmet, comb hair 10 times and smile, and 4) refuel - fill glass to water line and drink all water thru straw. The laps will be timed and winners determined by race time.

With one of the points of the Scout Law being that a Scout is reverent, a number of Cubs are working on their religious awards which will be presented on Scout Sunday in February.

The Troop has been working on various skills in preparation for the annual Klondike Derby to be held at Camp Berry on January 21. The Klondike Derby challenges patrols of 6 to 8 Scouts to use Scout skills to solve problems as their sleds race from one location to another. Approximately 70 sleds from the 13-county Black Swamp Area Council will be competing that day.

#### Treasures in Heaven —

One of my favorite sermons (thank you Pastor Luhring) is the French Fry Sermon. It was a wonderful lesson on God's sovereignty and our stewardship. The event behind the sermon (in case you haven't heard it) was a little boy who protested when his father, who bought him French fries, reached out to take one. The irony of this was not wasted on the father, who had provided the French fries.

Our Heavenly Father provides us with everything we need and many of our wants as well. However, He does not release ultimate ownership to us... it might be better described as a loan. Every gift that God gives us is to be used to His glory and for His family and its growth. It is an extension of the "blessed to be a blessing" principle. We love because He loved us. We give because He gave to us.

At times we find it hard to release items we have been given. There may be emotional ties to the item or a feeling of obligation to keep the item. But the best gifts are meant to be regifted... Christ's salvation, God's love, God's abundance. We don't need to <u>worry</u> about giving, because the Father who loves us owns everything.

So perhaps the best question to ask is, "What's your French Fry?"



As of December 27, we served 50 families or 162 people. We had 2 new families. There were 245 bags of food distributed with a value of \$2,450. Also, we were able to give each family a jar of jam for Christmas. Thank you to everyone who donated to the Meijer Simply Give program and especially on December 17 when your money was doubled in the gift cards. Meijer is a huge supporter of the area food pantries. Thank you to everyone who helps keep the pantry going. Blessed New Year!

## WINTER 2023 St. John Lutheran church, Defiance, Ohio LIFE WITH GOD: (LWG 1) Starting, Monday, January 9, 2023

Does God exist? What happens after death? Why are there so many different religions? Can the Bible be trusted? Why do bad things happen to me? I want to learn more about Lutheranism and become a member of a Christian Church.
