From Pastor Mews; "Hope is the good thing, maybe the best of things!" Dr. Martin Luther once said that, "The entire world moves on hope" Do you? Hope for a better life, hope for your family to do well, hope for peace and earth, hope for better health. Hope can be both good or bad! Sounds odd doesn't it? How can hope be good or bad. For those who have been hoping very long, they could lose heart and give in to despair. For those who believe and are willing to endure pain, hope can be a good thing. We are all imprisoned by our sin and our sinful nature. Too often we make walls of unbelief and despair, either by not having enough hope in Christ, or by being disappointed by unrealized hope. Like those imprisoned, hope can be both good or bad, depending on one's outlook or maturity in hope. The heartwarming classic movie, "The Shaw Shank Redemption" was a film of friendship and hope. Prisoners Andy Dufresne and Ellis Redding (Red), are close friends, both serving decades in prison for murder. Red was imprisoned for the murder as a young man he committed, and Andy was imprisoned for murdering his wife, but he was framed. Andy told Red that he hoped he go free, Red realizing the fraught of that, blatantly said, "Let me tell you something my friend, hope is a dangerous thing, hope can drive a man insane." The innocent Andy, never lost hope, but planned and over decades dug a hole to find freedom, escaping to Mexico. In freedom, Andy hoped that Red would go free and join him. In a letter, Andy wrote Red stating, "Remember Red, hope is a good thing, maybe the best of things, no good thing ever dies. He invited his friend to come join him in freedom. For us believers, we hope. We hope for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. We hope for eternal life with our Lord. In faith that hope is realized, even though we don't see the blessing of it yet. . This is the essence of faith, hoping for something unseen to become real. This Advent and Christmas, our services focus on hope, hope of our Lord descending on His throne to take us home. In the mean time, we have the hope that our Resurrected Lord will keep us in faith and lead us home in hope. The fellowship Board will be decorating the church on Monday. December 4th at 5 p. m. If anyone would like to come help and decorate. Your help would be appreciated.



Bible Study Opportunities



be available in mid-to-late December.








OUTREACH MINISTRY




