Pastor Mews' Epistle, February 2024

"HELP! I'm raising teenagers, young adults and adult children yet in my home" Part II

"Three things amaze me, no, four things, I will never understand- how an eagle flies so high in the sky, how a snake glides over a rock, how a ship navigates the ocean and why adolescents act the way they do." Proverbs 30:18-19 MSG

Last month we spoke about Luther's insight into parenting and some of the spiritual challenges facing parents and their kids. This month, we will look at some specific insight and tips into Christian parenting.

1. PARENTAL ROLES: An overview of what parents are to focus on in their child's life, year to year

0-2 years, Catering

2-10, Controlling

10-14, Coaching

15-18, Consulting

19+, Mentoring

- 2. Parents need to understand that they are constantly being 'fired,' and that as parents they need to reinvent the relationship. The goal is to look down the road to who we desire our children to be as they grow into adulthood. With that in mind, here are some things that work:
- *Tough love
- *Don't bail them out
- *Don't be a one-topic parent
- *The pain of discipline or the pain of regret
- *The reward and joy of "you earned it"
- *Develop an action plan
- **The result of enabling is that we raise entitled children who may not succeed on their own.

As C.S. Lewis says, "Hardship often prepares an ordinary person for an extraordinary destiny."

- 3. As our children move from childhood to youth and young adults, there are principles that can bless everyone;
- *Teach sexual integrity; remember: 100 one-minute talks, not 1 one-hundred-minute talk.
- *Help shape their behavior without crushing their spirit or their character.
- *Create media-safe homes. Do you check their phones and know what they're watching?
- *The GOAL: Responsible adulthood
- *Move them from dependence to independence.
- *Negotiate boundaries and express expectations.
- "They will never know how far away the town is if you carry them on your back."
- 4. As children now move from being a youth to young adult or adult, the role of parenting changes. Here are some things that work:
- *Experience is a much better teacher than advice. "
- *Ask permission to give advice.
- *Your role changes to coach, consult and mentor. We are no longer in control.
- *Unsolicited advice is usually taken as criticism. When youth or young adults receive advice, they don't hear a lesson, but don't respect that they're grown.

"But why does she need to go to Europe to find herself when I have all the answers for her life right now?"

One of the greatest gifts that God has given to us is our children. Pray and reflect on these as parents and grandparents as we walk with our Lord in this season of Epiphany, in the light of our newborn King as He makes His way toward Golgotha and our redemption.



We served 85 families in December or 250 people. A distribution of 345 bags of food worth \$5,175 was distributed. We had 13 new families visit our food pantry. Starting in February, we are changing the hours to 9:00 to 11:00 a.m., and continue to be open on Tuesday and Thursdays.

We are being featured at Meijer for the Simply Give Program. This has been the primary source for keeping our food pantry operational. During the upcoming campaign, the Double Match Day opportunities will be held on Saturday, March 2, and Saturday, March 23, 2024.

For every \$10 Simply Give card purchased on these dates, Meijer will provide an additional contribution of \$20, bringing the total to \$30 for a single customer purchase. Simply Give cards are available at the store at the end of the checkout lane or on the south receptionist desk.

Outreach Ministry seeks to share the Gospel of Christ within and outside of our walls to proclaim Jesus and the ministry of our church and school locally, nationally and globally.






