PASTOR MEWS' APRIL EPISTLE ARTICLE

All Are Welcome Here!

Frequently I drive by a church that heralds those words: "All are welcome here." Another way of saying that all are welcome here is in the word that is being used much more often: "inclusion". Whether it be in politics, the classroom, our work place, office, or any other arena in life, that word is "inclusion". Inclusion is currently defined as "the practice or policy of providing equal access to opportunities and resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized, such as those who have physical or intellectual disabilities and members of other minority groups." Who can disagree with that? It comes right out of Matthew 22:39.

For us Christians, we do hold to and strive for inclusion. We cherish the fact that God made everyone in His image. We champion that Jesus died for all and our mission and ministry is to love all. We do that to the best of our abilities and means. Jesus gives us a clear, living and applicable example to follow for Godly inclusion: "While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples". Matthew 9:10

A few thoughts on inclusion:

Inclusion without negotiating truth: In our modern day and age, many find religious exclusive claims to be harmful and divisive. It may seem awkward or painful to hold to exclusive claims about Jesus with family, friends and loved ones who don't believe in Jesus. As Rev. Timothy Keller stated, "What changed the world was that Christians who held to exclusive claims about Jesus being the only way, loved others like and unlike them sincerely, radically and genuinely." It showed that we can love like Jesus even though we might disagree. Jesus never denied the truth of who He is so that others may not be offended, but loved all dearly whether sinners at the table or foreigners in His land, like the Romans or even current enemies like the Samaritans.

Inclusion means warmth: Inclusion involves taking the time and effort to shake hands, give a warm smile and greet others genuinely, especially those who don't look or maybe act like us. No gimmicky slogans on a church marquee can ever overcome cold receptions, unwelcoming eyes and uncaring words.

Inclusion for those with limitations: Inclusion also means an effort to make sure that we do all we can to welcome others with physical or mental limitations. Our goal is to purchase and install a safer, better and more accommodating elevator. How can we minister to those with mental limitations? Our hope is to offer ministries and support for all our members from cradle to grave, over life changes, "and rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those who weep."

God included us as He called us in Baptismal waters. He sustains us in His house with His divine meal of His body and blood and nourishes our soul with His Word and the joy of fellowship with other believers.

All are welcome here and ABSOLUTELY included, by God's grace. Not only do we cherish inclusion, but let us also share that in thoughts, words and deeds. "We love, because Christ first loved us." God bless. Pastor KF Mews.

6:30-8:00 p.m.


PRIVATE COMMUNION

Information will be published in the church bulletin and in the Epistle for the Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger® Food Drive, Saturday, May 11, 2024.




The Clothes Closet,


