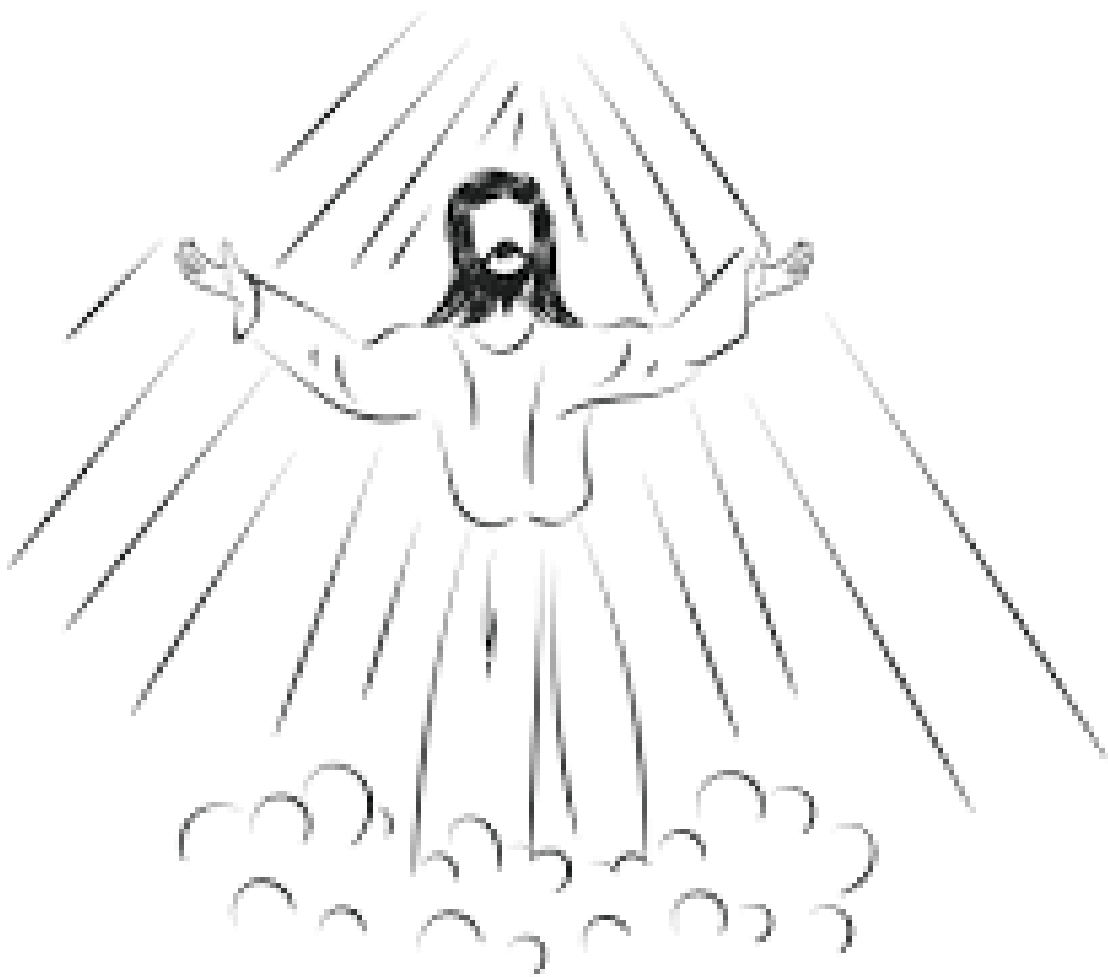

PASTOR MEWS' MAY EPISTLE ARTICLE

POVERTY:

Living in Defiance County and NW Ohio, we usually don't view ourselves as being in an area afflicted with poverty, but it's here. Nearly 10.7% of our county lives in poverty. Our food pantry and clothes closet ministers to some affected by it. At the April Pastor meeting, we discussed being aware and ministering to those in poverty in NW OH. Poverty can be defined as "A chronic and debilitating condition that results from multiple adverse synergistic risk factors and affects the mind body and soul." Poverty does not mean the same thing to the same people. Here's a check list to see if you could survive in poverty or middle class or in wealth.

Could you survive in poverty? Check out how you would do:

I know churches and sections of town that have the best rummage sales.

I know which rummage sales have 'bag sales' and when.

I know how to get someone out of jail

I know how to get a gun, even though I have a police record.

I know how to live without a checking account.

I know how to move in half a day.

I know how to keep my clothes from being stolen in the laundromat.

I know where to get and use food stamps and electronic cards for benefits.

I can get by without a car and I know where free clinics are.

I know how to live without electricity or the phone.

Could you survive in middle class?

I know how to get my kids into Little League, piano lessons, soccer, etc..

I know how to properly set a table.

My children know the best name brands in clothing.

I know how to order in a nice restaurant.

I know how to use a credit card and checking and savings accounts, and I understand an "annuity".

I talk to my children about going to college.

I know how to decorate my house for different holidays.

I know how to use the tools in my garage.

I understand life and disability insurance, 20/80 medical insurance policy.

I know how to get a library card and can repair items in my house or know repair services.

Could you survive in wealth?

I can read a menu in French, English and another language.

I have several favorite restaurants around the world.

I have at least two residences that are staffed and maintained.

I know how to host parties that key people attend.

I fly my own plane or my company plane.

I am on the board of two major charities.

I support or buy the work of a particular artist.

I know how to ensure loyalty and confidentiality from my domestic staff.

I know how to enroll my children in the preferred private schools.

How did you do? What did you learn? How did you feel? This gives us some insight on how those on the differing parts of the economic ladder survive and function. All of us can relate in some way to one, or maybe parts of two or three. We're led to thank God for all of His gifts, and are called to trust in God for all things. Through this we can become more sensitive to and caring of those in need and seek ways for justice for all. Finally, while we may be blessed materialistically, we who are in poverty in our sin and fallen nature have been redeemed. In heaven, we will be made wealthy in Christ with lavish homes and streets paved in gold .

LIFE WITH GOD: (LWG 1) *Starting, Monday, May 20, 2024*

Does God exist? What happens after death? Why are there so many different religions? Can the Bible be trusted? Why do bad things happen to me? I want to learn more about Lutheranism and become a member of a Christian Church. St. John's "Life with God" explores and answers these questions and more in an informal, enjoyable, yet beneficial way through a 12-session/week course called "**Life with God.**" (LWG 1). Sign up below. We ask that participants attend 10-12 classes, and there are videos over each class that can be viewed for missed classes. Those who complete this course can become communicant members if they desire. **Life with God** will be offered each winter, spring and fall. ***St. John members are asked to attend a "Life with God," class once every five years to renew and refresh their faith!*** LWG 1 is offered three times a year, in January, May and September!

TOPICS: Evidence for God's Existence, Saving Faith, Baptism, The Lord's Supper, The Bible, Law and Gospel, Living a Christian Life, Being a Part of the Body of Believers at St. John, The Reformation, Good Works, The Ten Commandments, Worship, & Christian Stewardship. Come to learn and grow together.

DATES: *Monday, May 20, 2024 thru Monday, August 19, 2024.* Classes are held on Monday evenings in the Adult Bible Study room A from 6:30-8:30 P.M.. Bring nothing. On the last class we will bring refreshments/snacks to share. After the 2nd class, no new class members are to join, and all will receive a class notebook to keep. A confirmation/new member date will be set in the future.

TEACHER: Pastor Mews, who has been teaching Life with God for over 22 years!

FOR: Adults or high school students desiring to be members of St. John Lutheran Church, or those who want to support those attending. This class is also for those who simply desire to renew their faith or explore the basic teachings of Christianity and Lutheranism with NO pressure to join.

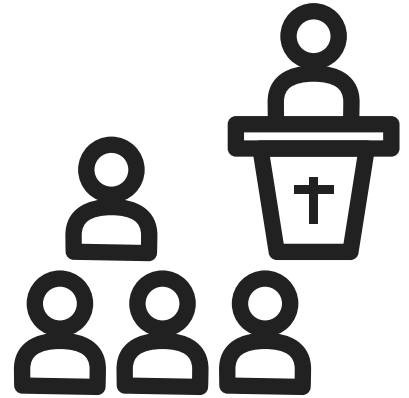

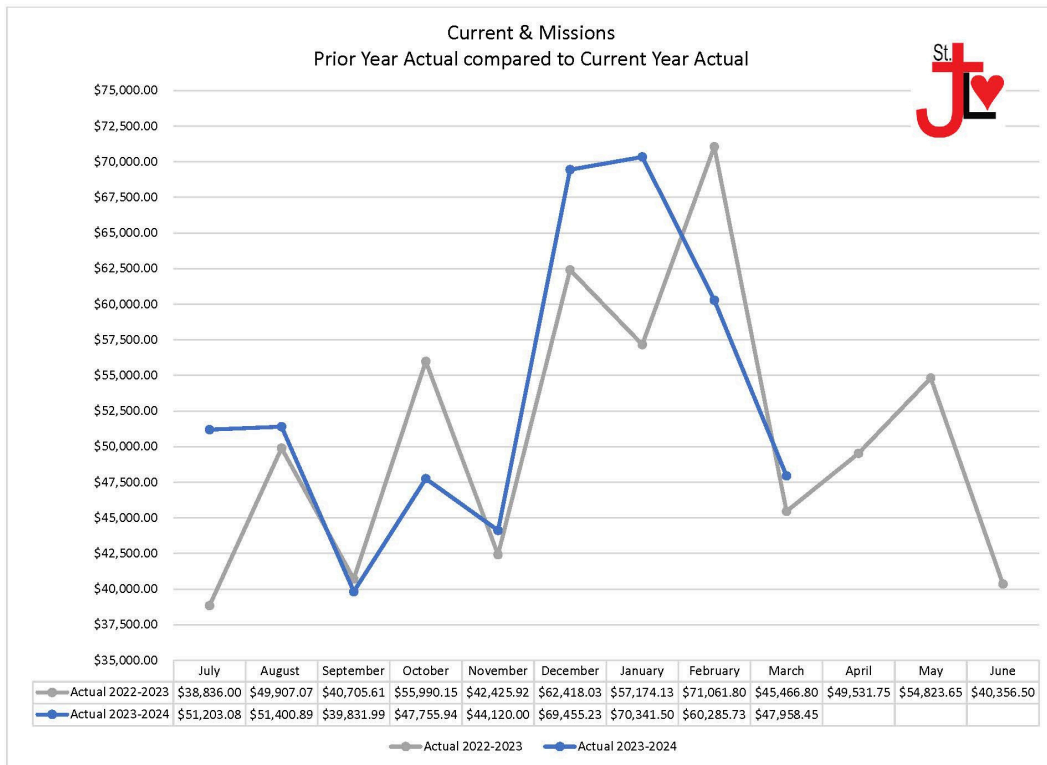

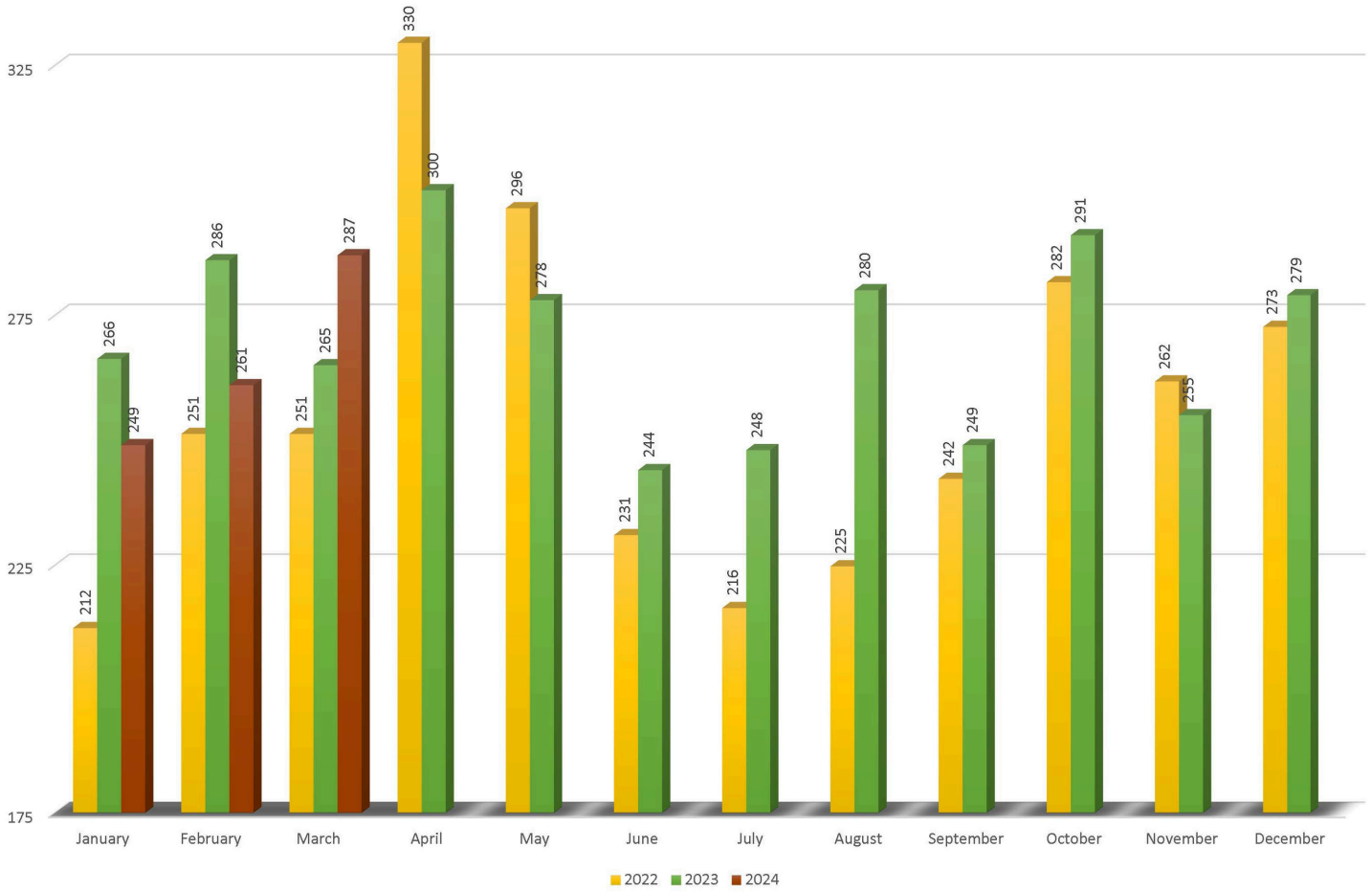

The Reason For God

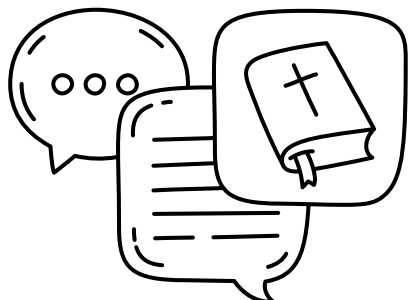

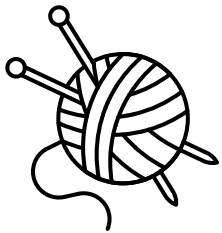

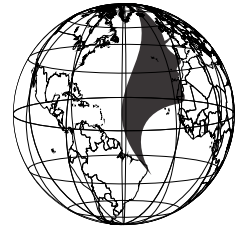

We served 69 families in the month of March or 185 people which includes three new families. We distributed 295 bags of food equal to \$4,425. Meijer Simply Give program ended on March 30, 2024. We were featured from December 31 to March 30th, 2024. We are waiting communication from Meijer on how many Meijer Gift Cards we will be receiving. Thanks to everyone who supported this program. The March Scouting for Food brought in 1,662 food items for our food pantry. Thank you to Cub Scout and Troop 75. Also, the Ladies Aid continues to donate non-food items once a month. We continue to sustain the Food Pantry by donations from congregation members, food drives, and occasional donations from the community.

The Clothes Closet,
located across the street from the school, continues to provide gently used clothing at an affordable price to our community. The Clothes Closet is open on Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and on Fridays from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. If you have a donation, you may drop it off on Monday or Tuesday from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. or during the times we are open.
