From the Desk of Pastor Mews





OCTOBER 2024 EPISTLE ARTICLE from Pastor Mews:

Dear Friends in Christ,

Greetings and peace in the name of Christ, our Savior.

One of the main reasons we know that God made mankind unique and apart from animals is that mankind embraces the arts, specifically music; animals have no affinity for it. Music is a gift from God. Dr. Martin Luther affirmed: "Beautiful music is the art of the prophets that can calm the agitations of the soul; it is one of the most magnificent and delightful presents God has given us." Others have noted, like Dick Dale; "Every song is like a painting." Hans Christian Anderson rightly states: "Where words fail, music begins!" What music do you find most moving?

As a history enthusiast over the last 7 years, my Reformation sermons and October Epistles looked back five hundred years, going back to the beginning of Luther's Reformation on 10/31/1517. Since 2017, my sermons have focused on Reformation events, sermons, publications, trials and historical milestones going back five hundred years from those years of 2017-2023. This year is no exception.

Five hundred years ago, in 1524, God worked through Luther to publish the Psalter, a translation of the Psalms into German. More significantly, and we all have been blessed by these, Luther and Johann Walter published the first Lutheran hymnal called "Achtliederbuch" or the "Book of 8 songs" Hence my opening statements about music. You and I have sung some of those hymns, but the real blessing is the treasury of God's Word and Luther's intent and purpose to write hymns.


From youth, Martin Luther was not only a gifted student and theologian, but he was a gifted musician and embraced music in his life, his home, his school and, most importantly, the Church. Luther sang with families he lived with during his studies and cherished singing in his school's choirs. Luther studied Aristotle's view on music and learned how to play the lute and master musical composition. Throughout his career, his hobby wasn't sports or fishing or drinking a liter of beer in the taverns of Germany, but to "Saran Wrapping" himself with all the musicians of any sort that he could come in contact with to grow himself and bless the Church.

Luther essentially believed that music, being God's good gift, was to be embraced by a church second in

Luther essentially believed that music, being God's good gift, was to be embraced by a church second in importance after the preaching of the pastor. When the Reformation began, Luther saw that a major vehicle to spread the Reformation was to follow in the footsteps of prophets and ancient Church fathers to compose hymns and spiritual songs from Psalms written in the native tongue. "This way the Word of God may be among the people in the form of music." A key doctrinal emphasis and change brought about by the Reformation was thee uncovering of the Biblical teaching of the "Priesthood of all Believers". In this, everyone can forgive sins and be part of the ministry. Prior to 1517, music was mostly observed, performed by priests and choirs. Because of the Reformation, everyone can sing, be involved in worship and, most importantly, sing "faith into their hearts through song". Look in your hymnals when we sing hymns and you will find that many of them, their words and music, were created by God through Dr. Luther. Note their words come from Scriptures themselves, and they focus on the great treasury of God's Word: free grace and salvation through Christ. On Sunday, September 8, St. John Lutheran Church had a congregational assembly. At this meeting the congregation affirmed and blessed our Lutheran School having preschool, kindergarten and grade 1. A number of St. John Lutheran teachers resigned and even though we extended the opening of school for two weeks until September 3, we were not able to secure high quality teachers after diligent and responsible searching. During this time more and more students enrolled in our school.

It is the hope and desire of the St. John Lutheran School Board, the principal and the congregation to yearly add classes with competent and dedicated Christian and Lutheran teachers and build enrollment. It was also emphasized repeatedly at this meeting that at no time or place was it ever an intent or plan to close the school. The school is a valuable and treasured ministry of our congregation and offers Gospel outreach with the love of Jesus to our community.

The congregation also has a plan of reconciliation in place to bless all of our ministries. Should you have any concerns or questions and need clarification of anything, contact Mr. Jeff Rohlf, our congregational chairman, Ms. Kristina Phipps, our Principal, Mrs. Krystle Clark, our Business Administrator, and/or Pastor Mews. The theme of our school year and the 2025 National High School Youth Gathering is "Endure". May we apply and cherish these blessed words from Hebrews 12:1-3; "Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the author, the founder and the perfecter of our faith."

Hello, Everyone!

There have been many changes here at St John since I wrote my article for the September Epistle. I hope you read the letter sent out by the church and school so you can understand why many of the changes had to happen.

All of our school families, both preschool and school-age, are now parking in the south parking lot and coming into the building through the main lobby entrance each morning. Please help our families stay safe by driving carefully through the parking lot and watching for families walking their children into the building as you come and go in the mornings, at the 11:30 preschool dismissal time, and at the 3:20 school-age dismissal time!

We are now doing combined chapels / children's talks with the preschool and school-age students together on Wednesday mornings at 9:00, rather than on Thursday mornings. For our first quarter, any offerings brought in by the children will be used to help purchase a goat and other needed supplies through Compassion International.

Damascus, a golden retriever, came and visited us on our second day of school. Damascus is a trained LCC K-9 Comfort Dog at St Paul Lutheran Church and School in Napoleon, OH. She interacts with people at churches, schools, nursing homes, hospitals, events, and in disaster-response situations. She showed us tricks she's learned with her handlers. Many of her tricks are to help her get into a good position to safely interact with individuals needing comfort. She let all of us pet her and hug her and feel her soft fur. The kids did not want her to leave! I am putting together a survey to distribute to our church members. Because we are now allowed to have volunteers back in the building, something that has not been allowed regularly since COVID, I want to learn who has talents and skills I don't know about and how you'd be willing to share these talents and skills with our students and families. We want our school families to develop relationships with our church members and vice versa. We also want members intentionally praying for our school students and their families. I sincerely hope you're one of the individuals who fills out the survey, making a commitment to help our school grow!

Thank you for all the support that has been shown to me and to all of my staff and our school families over the last month. It has been incredible!



Since January 1, 2024 we have served 650 families or 1,856 people with a distribution of 2.831 baas of food. In August, we served 87 families with 389 baas of food distributed and 11 new families visiting our pantry.

As of September 11, 2024 we have served 34 families and distributed 148 bags of food. That would be three serving days so far for September, with an average of serving 11 families in each 2-hour span. Needless to say, the volunteers are kept hopping filling the orders.

This year instead of aivina a baa of food for Thanksaivina, we are aoina to provide a can(s) of shredded turkey to our clients. If they have a family of four or more, they will receive two cans of turkey. We give a generous amount of other food items that will enhance their turkey meal. Fred and I will travel to Keystone in Lima to pick up the canned turkey. If you would like to contribute to the cost of the canned turkey, mark your donation to the food pantry-TURKEY. I am projecting spending \$900.00 for 9 cases of turkey. THANK YOU!

The food pantry relies on volunteers to help check people in and to fill the orders. This January through April, I have several people who will be going south for the winter. I NEED HELP!
