From the Desk of Pastor Mews

"Habits of Healthy Churches"

Thirteen of our members including myself attended the "Heartland Best Practices Conference" in October in Carmel, Indiana. We were blessed by the "Preparing for Amazement Ministries" sectionals at this conference. One was entitled "Habits of Healthy Churches", that offered wisdom, guidance, encouragement and practical solutions to bless our church in growing healthier. (The reality is that if an organism is healthy it grows!) Our Principal, Mrs. Kristina Phipps, has captured the essence of these habits and tied them to real-life habits, which I will now share:

7 Habits of Healthy Churches:

- 1. Healthy churches are praying churches.
- -They empower and celebrate prayer warriors.
- -They emphasize prayer.
- -They have seasons of prayer
- -They teach and preach on prayer.
- 2. Healthy churches do conflict well.
- -The priority in conflict is relational.
- -Conflict can be redemptive, because those who do conflict well create close bonds.
- -Matthew 18:15-20 gives a model for dealing with sin and conflict.
- 3. Healthy churches make decisions in a healthy way.
- -The Church is the Bride of Christ.
- -The Church is God's design to bring the Gospel and Kingdom of God to others.
- -The Church is the body of believers, unified in Christ, yet diverse in every other way.
- -The Church is a living organism, an organization of people with a common mission.
- 4. Healthy churches are focused more on those outside the church than those inside.
- -The Church exists for the good of others and the good of the world.
- -It's not about me, but us; it's about the Gospel of Jesus.
- -The purpose is outlined in The Great Commission. . . make disciples!
- 5. Healthy churches value process.
- -Process enables us to stop and hear and discern the whisper of God.
- -Process allows us to gather wisdom from the outside.
- -Process protects us from reactionism and leads to greater reflection.
- -Process enables focus in mission over methods and has many procedures, but few policies.
- 6. Healthy churches focus on adoption rather than assimilation.
- -Adoption is inviting you to our family because you are loved.
- -We want everyone to experience God's unconditional love and grace.
- -We want to support you as the Holy Spirit changes your life and makes you new.
- 7. Healthy churches are not territorial.
- -Healthy churches see buildings, furniture and other possessions as tools for ministry, not items to be guarded, hoarded or fought over.
- -Healthy churches use what God has given them with good stewardship.

What did you learn? Where are we? What can we improve? What can I do, you do, we do? As we enter into a new quarter-century and as our church moves to its 175th birthday, may God use the above words to bless and edify you, me, and the redeemed body of Christ at St. John Lutheran Church and School. Hello, Everyone,

I personally believe that I'm STARTING to get a handle on quite a few of the aspects that go along with the role of Principal here at St. John Lutheran School. I know I still have a long way to go, but I'm learning many things every single day. I'm very appreciative of all the support I continue to get from my church family. I love that individuals and groups have committed to praying daily for the school itself, the school and church combined, the teachers and staff, and our students and their families!

As a protection for our staff, our volunteers, and our students, we are requiring any adults who interact with our students as they come work or volunteer in the school more than one time to have a background check done. Krystle Clark is now able to do fingerprinting in-house as the church purchased a fingerprint scanner. These same workers and volunteers must complete a Ministry Safe video training. Some of you have already done one or both of these, and we greatly appreciate that. Sharing these requirements with you is my way of telling those of you who signed up on the surveys to volunteer or substitute in some capacity that I am making my lists and checking them twice. Be ready to serve when I call and ask!

I'm very excited to share my vision of what I want the school to look like for next school year. I want to open a combined classroom of first and second graders as well as a combined third and fourth grade class, while we continue to offer our preschool programs and kindergarten. We have families that we had to help enroll elsewhere back in August tell me they can't wait to send their children back here next year and have made sure they've stayed connected with us! We are currently putting together a call committee so we can call a synodically trained Lutheran teacher or two to come to St John. If you feel moved to help our school grow again and want to join the call committee, please let Jeff Rohlf or me know as soon as possible!

Our school board also strongly believes that we need to expand the childcare services we offer through our Tiger's Den Childcare Center. We want to get it back to what it was before the COVID shut-downs back in 2020. Before COVID, we were open to the community and still had the opportunity to share Jesus' love with children whose parents did not choose to send them to our school programs. Having this service available actually encouraged more families to enroll their children in our school programs so it became a blessing in so many ways.

With that being said, with the help of the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) who has provided us with the names and address of all the families in the area with children between the ages of birth through 10 years of age, we are sponsoring a major outreach activity in February. We're still in the beginning stages of planning, but want to have something fun here at the church and invite all of these families to it. This will also be right around the time we begin registration for next school year. The overall goal of this event would be to recruit families to expand our Tiger's Den now, and our preschool and school-age programs for next year. Plan to come be part of our growing process!
