

From the Desk of Pastor Mews

"The Church as Culture!"

Even though I'm a die-hard Ohio State Buckeye fan, these past 14 years I have beeen part of the Alabama "Roll-Tide," culture. Since 2011, I go to an Alabama home-football game yearly. I tailgate with Alabama fans, many times over 75,000 wear Alabama clothes, and even watch and root for Ohio State during that tailgate. I listen to the Alabama marching band go by, hear the roar of fans as state troopers escort the Alabama team to the stadium, then pack into a 100K-plus stadium and watch passionate Alabama fans with all their unique customs. Alabama football is perpetuated, improved, adapts, receives and expects excellence. That is the "Roll Tide" culture. Maybe you have similar experiences.

Many would say that the church is a building, a gathering of people, a denomination, organizational structure, or a set of religious and moral beliefs that influence people in small and great ways. To say that the church is a culture may seem to be odd and even strange. Yet the church is a culture.

We are all influenced by the culture around us - its beliefs and values, its passions and convictions. It teaches us how to behave, what is normal and good and how we should interact with each other. There is no un-enculturated person on this planet. Everyone is shaped by their interactions with others and that shaping becomes the culture in which one interacts with others. Some cultures are caring, loving and accepting; some cultures are toxic, cold and non-caring. Some cultures we cherish and serve. Other cultures we avoid.

The church is a culture, a distinct culture. It is formed, nurtured and perpetuated by the ongoing interaction of leaders and members. The church's organization with its staff and leaders guides the church toward a particular culture. However, church members also have a decisive voice in the formation of that culture. It's honest and best to say that leaders and members form the church's culture together.

Every church has its own culture, good or bad and the culture is self-perpetuating and always changing. The culture created by the pastor and leaders not only reinforces the culture, but can perpetuate it and even re-shape and re-form it.

Ultimately, the pastor and leaders have the primary voice in forming and telling the church's narrative. They act out the Christian life, teach the faith, show how it's lived and articulate policies and procedures. The congregation, both individually and collectively, embrace the culture, reshape the church's story, live out the Christian faith for people to see and also reteach the faith. Hence, everyone in the church is "complicit" in whatever is formed, good and bad.

That brings us to our congregation and the hiring of Church Doctor Ministry. For the next two years, by God's strength, they will listen to us and enable and strengthen us to create a Godly culture according to God's Word and the love and ministry of Jesus Christ. This ministry is called "Healthy Churches Thrive". It will begin with two ministries shortly:

- 1. An action team consisting of 5-7 active members and church staff to oversee the implementation of Church Doctors' recommendation
- 2. An all-congregation Summer Bible Study on Wednesday evenings taught by Pastor Mews based on the book and titled "Who Broke My Church?" This book will share how God works to create our congregation to become a spiritual culture that is shaped and formed in Christ Jesus and His Word. Watch for information.

My prayer is that all of our lives have been and are being influenced by the culture of Jesus Christ, baptized into and nurtured by Him, and that as a congregation we collectively embrace the mission and culture of our crucified and Risen Lord. God's peace! Pastor Kurt Mews.

From the Desk of Kristina Phipps



This year's theme for the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod nationwide...and for us here at St. John...was "Endure" based on Hebrews 12: 1-3: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted."

In the Biblical context, the word "endure" means the ability to withstand hardship, adversity, or persecution with patience and perseverance. Jesus, when He came down from heaven and became man, humbled Himself as He started His followers, even us followers today, on their / our faith journeys. In His humility, Jesus was willing to endure the cross for our sake and the shame that came with it as He Himself took on the punishment for OUR sins, not His own sins, as He had never sinned. He did this because of His love for us and to show us how much He wants us to be in heaven with Him.

We have to take an active role in our faithwalk with Jesus. We have to be willing to avoid distractions that hold us back from our relationship with Christ and to run the race our faith takes us on with determination and perseverance ourselves as we look at Jesus' life and model our lives after his example. Our staff here at St. John do this with our students. We teach them about Jesus and the Christian choices He wants us to make, we model those Christian choices for the students, and then we help the students practice those choices themselves. The long-term goal is that when the students leave our school, everyone will know they are Christians by their love and care for others as well as their love for God that shows in all of their actions.

We hope that as our students leave St. John, they will continue to be able to avoid distractions that interfere with their life-long relationship with God. We want them to look to Jesus and accept His forgiveness and His grace. We pray that they share their love of Jesus with their family, friends, future co-workers, and others they interact with during the course of their lives with the overall goal being that they "run with endurance the race that is set before us" as God's children.


DOUBLE THE MONEY!!
