PASTOR MEWS EPISTLE: September, 2025

KEEP YOUTH FROM "STAYING, NOT STRAYING" FROM THE CHURCH:

"Now you are the body of Christ and each one of you is a part of it."

1 Corinthians 12:27

This past month I returned from two motivating Christian gatherings: 1) "Endure," the 2025 LCMS Youth Gathering in New Orleans, from July 19-23, and 2) "Best Practices-Heartland," held August 8-10, in Frankenmuth, MI. Here is a review:

2025 LCMS YOUTH GATHERING, ENDURE:

This was my first gathering since 2007, and it was joy to see our young people as well as young people from around the world join in praise, growth and service. You, the people of SJL, helped to make that possible. More importantly, you invested in the faith and future of these young people to BE the church. A six-day trip with a variety of faith-enhancing experiences was a joy!

2025 HEARTLAND BEST PRACTICES:

At this conference, I was a speaker and twice led the session on "Why Youth Stay and Stray from the Church". Differing sources of data state that about 20% of LCMS baptized babies will be active in a LCMS church as an adult, and only 60-70% of baptized infants attend catechism instruction. SJL is not immune to this reality and these numbers aren't good.

BLENDING of ENDURE and BEST PRACTICES:

What enables youth to endure from infancy to adulthood? This is what the data, mostly from LCMS youth and young adults, says: The most influential people who help them endure in the faith are:

- -29% parents
- -13% pastor of home church
- -12% other family members
- -12% teacher
- -11% another pastor
- -10% youth minister

Other factors that assist young people to endure, mature in the faith and stay in the body of Christ:

- -Youth and parents do Christian ministry and service projects together.
- -Parents are active in the faith and their youth can discuss faith doubts with them.
- -Pastor(s) who show them personal concern
- -Attending a youth gathering or a Lutheran camp
- -Being involvéd in leadership and meaningful ministry in their local church

We are the Body of Christ. Youth and children are the Body of Christ, and they are the Church NOW!

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR US?

It's joyous and encouraging to lead, mentor, coach and be part of SJL in forming and building on this ministry. The blessing is that "Church Doctors" has a lot to offer to us. May Christ, who was crucified for all, lead us to be the Church so that all, both young and old, ARE part of the Body of Christ and Endure until our Lord calls us to our heavenly home. **And all God's people say, Amen!**

At the end of the campaign, the final totals, in addition to any online sales, Meijer matching, and other promotions, will be converted into Meijer food-only gift cards. These cards will allow our pantry staff members to purchase food.

I spend a little over \$1,000 a month from Meijer using the Meijer gift cards and buying the food items that we cannot obtain from the Toledo Food Bank and Seagate Food Bank. The Meijer Simply Give Program is a huge help for us and other food pantries in our community. Please mark your calendar for **Saturday, September 13** and have your \$10.00 contribution return back to our pantry for \$30.00.

We received \$14,000 worth of gift cards from the Meijer Simply Give Program that ended in June.

Sunday, September 14 will be Friendship Sunday and we will have a display for the Food Pantry. Stop by to pick-up a snack and an information sheet about St. John Food Pantry.

As of August 18, we served 55 families or 166 people. We distributed 229 bags of food worth \$3,435. We calculate a value of \$15.00 a bag. We have four more serving days in August. The final August report will be printed in the weekly bulletin.

Thank you for helping keep food on the St. John Lutheran Food Pantry shelves and serving the Defiance Community.

The Clothes Closet donated \$1,000 to the Defiance Furniture Bank, \$1,000 to Operation K.A.V.I.C (Keller Assists Veterans In Crisis), and \$50 a month towards missions.
