

From the Desk of Pastor Mews





"TWISTED CAROLS THE WORLD SINGS, BLESSED CAROLS THE CHURCH SINGS!"

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we approach the end of the calendar year, the church celebrates Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. Music fills the air. God's Word is of song and praise: "Glory to God in the highest and peace to men on whom His favor rests." We hear from Luke that after the shepherds found Jesus, they left "glorifying God for the things they have heard and seen." Before this, Luke shares Mary's song, the Magnificat, "My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior." Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, sang, "Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, for He has come and redeemed His people."

This time of year, music fills the air, mostly syrupy songs of Christmas cheer and exaggerated memories. The Christian Church during this time has been given a treasury of hymns and songs that celebrate the incarnation of God in the person and work of Jesus Christ. A believer told me that as we sing to others with these Christmas carols, we evangelize the Gospel to those who hear. Carols, and all Christian hymns, sing faith into hearts.

The world sings "twisted" carols to us:

- "Joy to the Mall"
- "Oh, Come and Be Faithless"
- "Hark, the Herald Admen Sing"
- "O Little Town of Worn-Out Men"
- "Silent Mouths and Unholy Nights"
- "I'm So Glad when Christmas Goes"

The list can go on. Though we find them somewhat humorous and thought-provoking, these bogus titles remind us of Satan and our fallen world that seek to deceive us and turn us to worship those things other than Christ.

May God lead us to cherish these hymns and treasure their lyrics, since they deepen our faith and lead us to greater appreciation of God's truth at the birth of Christ. Take, for example, the deep treasures of "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing". Reflect on the first stanza: "Hark! The herald angels sing, 'Glory to the new born King,' Peace on earth and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled, Joyful all you nations rise, join the triumph of the skies, with the angelic host proclaim, 'Christ is born in Bethlehem.' Hark! the herald angels sing, 'Glory to the new born King.'"

Notice we are invited to see the angels worship God, then we hear the reason for the newborn King, then you and I are reconciled, and finally, we, being all nations, are asked to join in triumph and sing "Glory to the new born King."

May the Lord lead us to treasure and proclaim these holy, timely, Godly and evangelical carols. We as sinners have been reconciled to God, by Christ, through His death and resurrection, and we may join the angelic choir in eternal heavenly praise. The Lord bless your holy days. The St. John Lutheran Food Pantry is open on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. If you meet the Federal Income Guidelines, then you can visit once a month to our food pantry. With each visit you need to bring ID with current address. If you do not have an updated ID, then bring in a current bill with your address.

Since January 1, 2025 we have served 909 families or 2,676 people with a distribution of 4,134 bags of food.

As of November 4, 2025 we have served 84 families and distributed 268 bags of food and had sixteen families visit our pantry for the first time. We are having an increase in clients because of no SNAP benefits. Needless to say, the volunteers are busy filling the orders. The Thanksgiving food item distribution is going well; however, I anticipate running short on items. If you would like to donate, we could use the following: corn muffin mix, cranberry sauce, evaporated milk, turkey gravy, canned pumpkin and stuffing. Others are purchasing as well, so if we all contribute a little, we should be good. Thank you to everyone who has donated so generously already.

Fred and I are going to Lima on Tuesday, November 18, to pick up more 28-ounce canned turkey from Keystore Meats.

On Wednesday, November 19, we will have our monthly food run to Toledo to get more food. Mark Roehrig, Walt Smith and Mike Shawley leave at 6:30 a.m. and return around 10:30 with a load. Thank you to Phil Rohlf for letting us use his trailer every month!!

THANK YOU to Jim and Janet Seymour for their commitment to the food pantry for 13 years filling orders. They have been a true blessing and we will miss them.

I also want to thank the Endowment Committee for the recent purchase of an 8.8 cubic foot chest freezer for the food pantry. This will replace a freezer that needs to retire!!

The food pantry relies on volunteers to help check people in and to fill the orders. During January through April, I have several people who will be going south for the winter. I NEED HELP! located across the street from the school, continues to provide gently used clothing at an affordable price to our community. The Clothes Closet is open on Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and on Fridays from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. If you have a donation, you may drop it off on Monday or Tuesday from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. or during the times we are open. Bring donations and come on in and do a little shopping. The Clothes Closet took in \$18,603.34 in 2024. We also helped 60 families with 110 bags of free clothing. The Clothes Closet donated \$1,000 to the Defiance Furniture Bank, \$1,000 to Operation K.A.V.I.C (Keller Assists Veterans In Crisis), and \$50 a month towards missions. We also funded the ramp out in front of the Clothes Closet. OUTREACH TEAM MINISTRY Nov. & Dec. 2025



Outreach Ministry seeks to share the Gospel of Christ within and outside of our walls to proclaim Jesus and the ministry of our church and school locally, nationally and globally.

Outreach had a presence at the at the Defiance Halloween Parade and thus, was able to interact with a large number of individuals. New Testament Bibles, St. John magnets with contact information and worship times, Christian wrist bands, small crosses, Christian coloring books with crayons, small molded figures of Jesus, Scripture cards and Thrivent T-shirts were available for those who were interested.

Outreach Ministry will feature a Nativity scene along with a large St. John Lutheran Church banner at the Christmas Cruise-Thru at the Defiance County Fairgrounds in Hicksville from November 24 – December 28. In 2024, this display was viewed by approximately 50,000 visitors and thus, the St. John Nativity scene was viewed by many.
